Student Art Program

ArtsConnection's Student Art Program connects young artists from NYC public schools with corporate partners through exhibitions of student artwork, transforming art from a subject studied at school into a professional endeavor.

This fall, interns will work with the Teen Programs Manager for Exhibitions to gain valuable job-readiness and administrative skills associated with organizing student art exhibitions. They will gain a full view of a non-profit arts-in-education organization, with exposure to daily operations, programming meetings, and client meetings. Interns will:

- Learn about curating and installing art through viewing current exhibitions and participating in preparing for upcoming exhibitions
- Contribute to ArtsConnection Teen Programs online blog The JAR
- Contribute to outreach plan for program to students and teachers
- Communicate with currently exhibiting artists
- Create online galleries using Wordpress
